The 2017-22 Strategic Plan, Implementation Plan, and Board Structure were confirmed and posted in the Document Library on the National website). Highlights of the Board meeting

- Nancy Spetzler (Phoenix) and Andi Purple (MWC), Co-Chairs of the Long Range Planning Committee, presented suggested revisions to the plans.
- A status report on the retention of an Association Management Company was given. A Proposal Task Force (other members include Angela Phillips Diaz (MWC) and Jennifer Henson) evaluated, references checked, and on-site visits scheduled. After on-site visits, the Committee to enter into contract negotiations with the finalist. The transition is expected to begin operations on July 1, 2017.
- Jackie Henson (MWC), Chair of the Governance Committee, outlined proposed revisions at a special meeting via conference call on February 17, 2017, the National Board approved the Strategic Plan, the 2017-22 Implementation Plan Guidelines, and Board Structure, effective July 1, 2017.

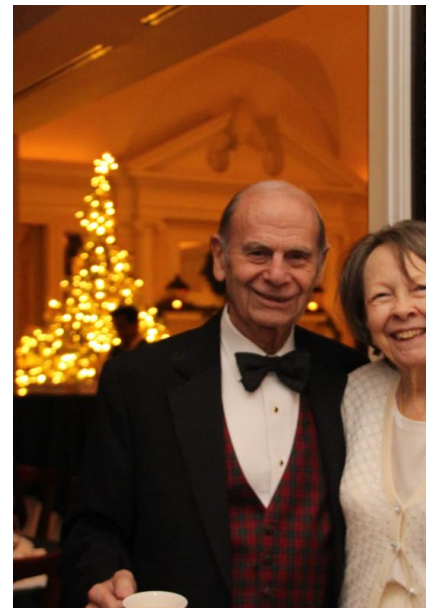
